Weather Report: **Late Afternoon:** Rain and snow. High near 34. North wind around 14 mph. Chance of precipitation is 100%. Total daytime snow accumulation of less than a half inch possible.

Tonight: Snow. Low around 25. North wind between 11 and 15 mph. Chance of precipitation is 80%. New snow accumulation of 3 to 5 inches possible.

All radio traffic will be conducted through EOC at Conover Fire Department via Conover Tactical Channel 6
